Other information:

- Joanne is 25, single and has chronic asthma.
- She is looking for Customer Service, general office admin work, or work in a hotel (such as a receptionist).
- She has no car, so uses public transport. (The bus service is limited in the early mornings, evenings and Sundays but is regular during the day).
- She has no internet access at home. She needs to visit town to visit the library or Jobcentre. This is a two hour return journey.
- Joanne has agreed to attend a local Job-Club on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This activity is not mandatory. It takes 15 minutes for her to walk to the Job-Club.

Expected to undertake work search for 35 hours per week.
