Please provide numbers of refused Universal Credit claims based on failed habitual residency for EEU citizens since the day Universal Credit was introduced. Please provide details how this assessment is carried on and what documents are requested to carry on such assessments.

DWP Response:

In regards to your first query, to provide numbers of refused Universal Credit claims based on failed habitual residence tests, I can confirm that we hold information falling within the description specified in your request. However, we estimate that the cost of complying with your request would exceed the appropriate limit for central Government, set by regulations at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending $3\frac{1}{2}$ working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting it.

Under section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act the Department is not therefore obliged to comply with your request and we will not be processing it further.

Under section 16 of the Act we should help you narrow your request so that it may fall beneath the cost limit.

You can narrow your request by:

- Requesting data that we hold from July 2018 to date, selecting a period between these dates.
- Requesting your second query regarding the habitual residency test assessment.

We will consider afresh any revised request however we cannot guarantee that any revised request will fall within the cost limit.
