Changes to business operation and staff	<p>Peterborough has high levels of unemployment and higher than average levels of youth unemployment with DWP figures indicating approx 600+ 18 - 24 years old are unemployed. This equates to more than 12% of the total long term unemployed for the city. Of these 340 were unemployed for over 6 months.</p> <p>To address this a bid was made to the Department for Work and Pensions to join the Future Jobs Fund scheme. This scheme provides funding to create subsidised short term new jobs with local partners. During the period of employment and for a short period afterwards it also provides funding for training on job search techniques including; CV writing, interview techniques etc and 1:1 coaching and advice. This is aimed at assisting candidates in securing further sustainable employment.</p> <p>Phase 1 of the funding will provide 167 candidates with 26 weeks of employment for 27 hrs a week at minimum wage.</p> <p>Phase 2 will provide 238 jobs as above with 159 targeted at 18 - 24 year olds and 79 targeted at 25 + years old in employment hotspots such as Central Ward.</p> <p>At completion the project will have provided more than 400 local young people with work experience and the necessary skills to obtain further long term employment.</p>
