Freedom of Information Request - RFI20130205

Thank you for your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) received on 12th February, seeking the following information:

"a complete breakdown of incidents of social media misuse by employees within the BBC in the last three years. Please provide as much detail as possible in your response, such as:

- Please state the format of misuse e.g Facebook, Twitter etc.
- Please state the action taken disciplinary, dismissal etc.
- Please provide relevant detail to each incident e.g breach of confidential information"
 Please clarify the department involved in each case"

The BBC records details of disciplinary cases on a central case management database. It is not mandatory for the 'category' or 'outcome' to be entered on the database, and there are a number of cases where this information is not available. These cases are not included in the numbers provided.

We have looked at all cases logged since Ist January 2010 and have found that there is I case where misuse of social media is recorded as the reason for disciplinary in this time.

Under section 40(2) of the Act, we are withholding the information requested on the detail and outcome of the disciplinary. As the request relates to a small number of staff, this could lead to individuals being identified. Personal information about living individuals is exempt if disclosure to a third party would breach one or more principles of the Data Protection Act 1998. As individuals who work at the BBC do not expect their personal information to be disclosed, to do so would be unfair; therefore, disclosure would breach the First Data Protection Principle, fairness.
