Dear Sam watson ,

Thank you for your email of 10 June where you requested the following information:

'Dear Department for International Trade, Please tell me how much the arms deals were worth that the British government licensed to Israel each year from 2013 until the present time please. Please also tell me exactly which weapons these were for the last 3 years please'.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'), you have the right to:

- know whether we hold the information you require
- be provided with that information (subject to any exemptions under the Act which may apply).

I can confirm that the Department for International Trade does hold information in relation to your request.

Section 21 (Information reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means)

The information you have requested is exempt from disclosure by virtue of Section 21 (Information reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means) of the Act.

Information about licences is included in the Annual and Quarterly Reports on Strategic Export Controls. These reports contain detailed information on export licences issued, refused, or revoked, by destination, including the overall value, type (e.g. Military, Other) and a summary of the items covered by these licences. They are available to view on GOV.UK at:

<https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/strategic-export-controls-licensing-data>.

This currently includes information about export licences granted, refused, or revoked up to 31 December 2019.

Finally, you may wish to be aware that a searchable database is provided that allows bespoke searches of published data to be conducted. This database can be accessed at <https://www.exportcontroldb.trade.gov.uk/>. You will have to register to use this service, but registration is free.

Appeals procedure

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original request and should be addressed to the Information Rights Unit:
