You asked for the following information:

Can you please provide a list of all vehicles owned by your ambulance service, what the vehicle is (medic 1, transport, ambulance, etc.), where the vehicle is based and index plates.

Response

We do not give registration (index) numbers for security/terrorist/risk reasons. We cannot give detailed location information as vehicles are moved on a daily basis, depending on patient demand.

Please also note, not all Service operated vehicles are owned by the Service (e.g. Medic 1 in your example).

Review Procedure
