PLAN AHEAD - HOW WILL YOUR TRAVEL BE AFFECTED?


You may be affected by road closures associated with Vélo Birmingham & Midlands. Where possible we recommend planning travel ahead. On the day you can also use Google maps or a satellite enabled/live update GPS to navigate around the road closures as the route and road closures will be updated live.

In order to ensure the safety of the participants and the general public there will also be parking restrictions in place along the event route. For those affected we advise using local parking locations, your own driveway or alternative roads clear of the route.

Whilst the cycling route will be closed to vehicles, pedestrian access via existing defined footpaths and pavements is maintained and we advise all pedestrians to use footpaths and existing crossing points where possible. In some sections of the route there is a lack of suitable footpaths and pedestrian access to the road will be facilitated for access purposes only. Please take extra care when navigating roads along the route and ask an event steward for assistance if you are unsure.



Take part: General entries have sold out, but we have reserved places for residents to join in. All abilities are welcome... and lycra isn't compulsory! Please email for information.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Plan ahead:

- Check out the road closure times and the interactive route map on www.velobirmingham.com
- Consider the best mode of transport, departure time and route to avoid the road closures.
- Allow plenty of time for travel.
- Businesses may need to review delivery schedules, liaise with staff regarding rotas and access arrangements during road closure times.
- Visit the 'Resident Info' section on the event website for more travel advice and FAQs.

Parking: If you usually park on a road used for the event, please move your vehicle the night before. Vehicles cannot be parked on the event route from 00:01 on Sunday May 12. Any vehicle left on the cycling route or parked in a suspended parking bay will be removed. Keep an eye out for traffic enforcement notices which will go out 2 weeks before the event. There is a risk your car will be towed if you do not comply with these notices.

Litter and waste management: A full cleanse of the rider Pit Stops and the wider route will take place before and after the event to make sure it is left how we found it.

Emergency services: Access for emergency services will be unaffected throughout the closures and will always be prioritised during the event. Members of the public should follow normal protocol when reporting an emergency. Please note that the event has its own medical provider to cover the needs of participants.

Community welfare and carers: We appreciate the importance of the delivery of care and we will work closely with care providers and individuals to make sure that care visits are delivered throughout the road closure period. Care providers should plan their journeys ahead taking into account road closure times and potential increased traffic on some roads. Any carers who have any concerns or need assistance planning travel should contact us on

On-call doctors, vets and district nurses: If you are an on-call doctor, vet or district nurse that may be affected by the road closures, you can get in touch with us on .
