Definition of partner for Great Britain: Someone to whom the customer is either married, in a civil partnership with, or living together with as if married.

Consider paying the customer's Pension Credit to a responsible person such as a relative or friend if the:

- customer does not have a responsible and willing partner, or payment to their responsible partner would cause difficulties
- responsible person has asked for help and agrees to be the responsible payee.
 - If the responsible person has been asked to help and agrees to be the responsible payee:
- 1. Check if Pension Credit is the customer's main income.
- 2. If Pension Credit is only part of the customer's income, consider making the customer's Pension Credit payment to the responsible person.
- 3. If Pension Credit is the customer's only income, consider paying a small amount to the customer for their personal use and the balance to the responsible payee. Note: To maintain the case on Income Support Computer System (ISCS), you must pay the customer at least 10p weekly by ISCS, and the balance to the responsible partner clerically. Take a common sense approach about the amount to pay to the customer, based on the circumstances of each case.
