Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("FOIA") request

I refer to your recent request for information made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

Under the Act, public authorities have two duties to individuals requesting information: firstly, to confirm whether or not they hold the information requested, and secondly to provide a copy of that information unless one or more of the exemptions under the Act apply.

I can confirm that we do not hold information relating to your request.

Your request

I would like to know who was involved in the design of the 2015-onward A level subject content required for Economics A-level specifications. Give me all information that you hold and can make public about the names, qualifications, experience of that committee/group of people who decided the topics that would be in the subject content for Economics.

I would also like the minutes of the meetings about the A level subject content for Economics, if that is possible. Otherwise the above will suffice.

Our response

Ofqual's role was to determine the assessment rules which exam boards used to develop reformed A and AS levels. It was the Department for Education who determined the subject content for the reformed A level Economics. You might find a useful explanation in our postcards about reform, which can be found on our

webpage: Ofqual postcards: GCSE, AS and A level reforms, particularly the accreditation postcard. You may also find the Independent Chair's report on the review of current GCE 'specification content' within subject criteria' interesting. It examined what changes to subject criteria (content and skills) were thought necessary by stakeholders, (especially, but not exclusively HE), which was published in 2013.

I understand that you have also contacted the Department for Education with this request and I believe they may be able to help you with your request.
