Thank you for your request dated the 20th July 2021. We can confirm that the CCGs do hold the information that you have requested. Please see our responses below:

How many instances of the Microsoft Windows XP Operating System are currently in operation across your entire network ? How many devices such as kiosks, lap tops etc are still running Windows XP?

No instances of the system are currently in operation or devices still running.

Who is the officer responsible for maintaining and delivering legacy applications to all your users?

The CCGs' responsibility is to ensure that no one has access to legacy applications. Therefore no one is responsible for delivering legacy application to users, likewise no one is responsible for maintaining them.
