# 2. How many civilians do you employ (by name of role, FTE, and what department they are attached to how you record the information and what division they are attached to)?

In terms of Section 16 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, I am refusing to provide you with the numbers and names of each role for police staff. Section 16 of the Act requires Police Service of Scotland to provide you with a notice which: (a) states that it holds the information, (b) states that it is claiming an exemption, (c) specifies the exemption in question and (d) states, if that would not be otherwise apparent, why the exemption applies.

I can confirm that Police Scotland holds the information that you have requested.

The exemptions that I consider to be applicable to the information requested by you is as follows:

#### 35 (1) (a) & (b) - Law Enforcement

Release of specific levels of police staffing would adversely impact on the operational effectiveness of the Service. Being aware of deployment details would allow persons or groups intent on committing offences or causing disorder with the means to make a reasonable assessment of police strengths in certain specific roles. This in turn would allow those individuals or groups to make an accurate assessment of the capacity of the Service to deal with certain specific incidents, compromising any tactical advantage the police may have over such persons or groups when dealing with any crime or disorder.

This is a non-absolute exemption and requires the application of the Public Interest Test.

#### 39 (1) - Health, safety and the environment

The information requested is exempt as its disclosure would or would be likely to endanger the physical health or safety of an individual. As previously described, to disclose the strategic intentions of the police service would allow those intent on committing crime or causing disorder to gauge the likelihood of detection or to take measures to negate the likelihood of detection. This would leave members of the public at an increased risk of being the victim of crime, unruly or intimidating behaviour and jeopardise wider community safety.

This is a non-absolute exemption and requires the application of the Public Interest Test.

### **Public Interest Test**

As you will be aware, the exemptions listed above are non-absolute and require the application of the Public Interest Test. I would suggest that public accountability would favour disclosure, given that the information concerns the efficient and effective use of resources by the Service. Likewise, disclosure of the information would also inform the public debate on the issue of policing and contribute to the accuracy of that debate.

Furthermore, the applicability of the exemptions listed above, the need to ensure the effective conduct of the service in relation to prevention and detection of crime and, the public safety considerations involved in the delivery of operational policing clearly favour non-disclosure of the information requested.

Moreover, the United Kingdom currently faces a sustained threat from violent terrorists and extremists. The current threat level for international terrorism for the UK is assessed as 'severe'. This means that an attack is highly likely and may occur without warning, but there is no specific intelligence of a terrorist attack.

On balance I would contend that the public interest in disclosing the information is outweighed by that in maintaining the exemptions listed, as it is doubtful if it can ever be in the public interest to disclose information which would prejudice the prevention or detection of crime or, which would jeopardise the delivery of operational policing and the safety of officers and police staff.

By way of assistance, the number of Civilians employed by Police Scotland excluding agency staff as at 31 March 2017 was 5233.237 (to three decimal places). To be of further assistance, whilst we cannot supply the information by post we can supply by the Department and Division of Police Staff who were currently employed by Police Scotland as at 31 March 2017.
