## A history of the King Edward VI Foundation



In 1547 a Royal Commission dissolved the Gild of the Holy Cross and certain influential men of Birmingham petitioned Edward VI for the return of the gild lands in the form of an endowment for a free grammar school. On 2 January 1552 letters patent were sealed, granting this request and appointing 20 of the foremost inhabitants of the town as Governors of a school to be held in the old guildhall in New Street. The school was King Edward's School.

In 1831 the Governors were empowered for the first time to create other schools of the Foundation of King Edward VI in addition to King Edward's School itself. Between 1838 and 1853 eight elementary schools were opened.

The Foundation was able to extend its size and scope because of centuries of shrewd investment. Accepting from Edward VI land, rather than money, the Governors took seriously to the business of property development. The expansion of Birmingham in the nineteenth century was particularly profitable.

By the 1870s the elementary schools had outlasted their usefulness, and the pressing need was for grammar schools. The structure of the Foundation was changed once more. Grammar schools were created at Aston, Camp Hill (Boys and Girls), Five Ways and Handsworth, whilst King Edward's School acquired a sister – the High School for Girls, housed in an adjoining building. All but Aston and Handsworth now function from sites to which they were transferred after 1936.

The most recent addition to the family was King Edward VI Sheldon Heath Academy, a mixed ability school serving its local community.

Education has been at the heart of this City for many generations and the excellence that The Schools of King Edward VI provide will undoubtedly help the City as it continues to move "Forward" through its next period of re-invention.

### OUR TWO INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS





Our two independent schools are located in their own imposing buildings on a beautiful 50 acre site close to the University in Edgbaston. Boys and girls share the fabulous facilities of the Ruddock Performing Arts Centre which is a professional standard concert hall and venue for drama productions and seminars.

In addition the schools offer unparalleled opportunities for those who have a desire to excel in sport or participate in an exceptional array of other extra-curricular activities including work in the community and fundraising for charity.

Whilst the independent schools do charge fees they have means-tested funds to provide free and assisted places to boys and girls who are successful in the entrance examinations held in January/February each year.

### OUR FIVE FREE GRAMMAR SCHOOLS






Our five grammar schools have been located in the City of Birmingham since 1883. The schools do not charge fees, but there is an entrance test which children take and their scores determine entry. With almost 6,000 taking the test every year in September there is obviously strong competition for every place.













### OUR SPONSORED ACADEMY




KING EDWARD VI SHELDON HEATH ACADEMY

Children who are achieving Level 5 in their SATs have the chance to succeed in the test. From September 2015 entry onwards children eligible for pupil premium will be given priority for a number of places at these schools provided they achieve a qualifying score which will be announced before the test. King Edward VI Sheldon Heath Academy is a mixedability school which serves the surrounding local community. The Academy is free to attend and children are not required to take any form of entrance test as their home address is the main consideration for entry. The Academy is housed in brand new buildings and has its own sixth form. "KESH" as it is known locally is carving out its own history as the latest of The Schools of King Edward VI in Birmingham.
