Please see attached copies of the forms and documents requested above; the following document (WPSOP17\_In-Work-Support\_Partner-v4.0) is being withheld under Section 43 of the FOI Act.

Section 43 relates to the commercial interests of both the Department and our suppliers. I consider that this exemption applies because it is intended to protect the ability of the Department to obtain goods or services on the best possible commercial terms and to protect the legitimate commercial interests of our suppliers. I maintain that the information in above mentioned document falls within this category.

The information has been withheld under Section 43 because it details of the supplier's approach to delivering the service specified by the Department. This is deemed to be a unique approach and as such is the intellectual property of the supplier and not to be shared with competitors. Disclosure could therefore prejudice the supplier's commercial interests, and so this information is being withheld as allowed by Section 43 of the FOI Act.

In applying this exemption the Department has balanced the public interest in withholding the information against the public interest in disclosing the information. The public interest is best served by ensuring that companies are able to compete fairly and that there is competition for public sector contracts. The release of the information as requested could potentially inhibit or

limit the ability of the Department to obtain best value for money terms arising from such competition.
