





Desborough Town Council - Funded Highway Works

Dear

Good to meet up with yourself last week and the councillors to discuss further the proposals for the Zebra Crossing by the Library and the one-way system for Gladstone Street / St Nichols Street.

and myself have spoken to the manager of the Design Section with regard to timescales for the design process and providing a cost estimate unfortunately, due to workloads they wouldn't be able to start this until April. The Zebra crossing proposal however should be fairly straight forward. Once the design is completed and the cost confirmed acceptable to the Town Council then this could be programmed (hopefully!) for the late summer.

We also discussed the two options for the one way system and Option 1 seemed to have the most benefits. Firstly all traffic exiting the area would use the southern (Gladstone Street) exit onto the B576 which has far better visibility than the Nichols Street exit which is restricted by the brow of the railway bridge. This would also reduce congestion along both routes as there would be no opposing traffic and less possibility of damage to residents. With this option we may also be able to review the parking restrictions along this area to provide additional spaces.

The one way system would involve a slightly more involved process but again we would hope, subject to satisfactory outcome of the consultations, that this could be in place either later this year or early 2018. We would ask that the Town Council carry out consultations with residents / business affected by the proposals once we have investigated this further and produced a suitable drawing.

I will arrange for the Town Council to be invoiced for the sum of £3,000 + VAT for the start this process for the two sites towards the end of February ready for the design process to start.

Taking each location in turn my comments are as follows:

1. Pedestrian Crossing on High Street

Probable cost of zebra crossing would be in the region of £25,000 – main variable of this would be the current carriageway condition as this may require re-surfacing to allow laying of "anti-skid" surfacing on the approaches, the £25,000 figure would cover this.

2. Lay-by outside Desborough Library

Looking at Google I don't think that a lay-by immediately outside the library would be viable as the bus stop is here at present as well as a telegraph pole, post box and BT cabinet, and care would have to be taken not to locate it too near to the Saxon Close junction to ensure visibility is maintain for drivers exiting from this road. It may however be possible to located further along, outside the shops as there appears to be less obstructions in this area. The cost would be dependent on the length of the bay, and what utility equipment is in the area, but a bay for about 4 vehicles (25 metres in length) would be around £15 - 20,000 to implement.

Also to be noted is that the introduction of a bay here may preclude the introduction of a pedestrian crossing in this area at a later date.

3. Junction improvements at High Street & Gold Street

The possibility of widening this junction to allow two lanes of vehicles to stack was investigated in 2010. At that time the cost of the engineering works was estimated at £25,000 which included widening on the approach to the junction for 20 metres, new carriageway construction and relocating signs etc. However, the big issue with this proposal is that the services in the existing footway would need diverting (gas, water, BT etc.) and at the time this was estimated at an additional £75,000. So I would think we would be looking now at around £120,000 in total (with increases in costs inflation etc.) although to give a precise estimate we would need to get firm prices from the utility companies for the relocation / protection of their equipment.

4. One way system on Gladstone Street / St Nichols Street.

We looked at this last year and came up with a couple of options which are detailed below (Dwgs attached).

Option 1 shows Gladstone Street one way westbound and Nichols Street one way eastbound (the green arrows indicate the direction of flow). The areas indicated by the red lines near the CoOp roundabout and the Gladstone Street / Nichols Street junction are kerbed buildouts to narrow the road at these points to deter traffic entering the one way system from the wrong direction. These could also incorporate drop kerbs to form safe crossing points for pedestrians and to form a defined parking bay (indicated by the blue hatched line) along the south side of Gladstone Street up to the Nichols Street junction. Drivers approaching from the CoOp roundabout would have to give way at the Gladstone Street / Nichols Street junction, again indicated by the broken blue lines.

This option would require approximately five new illuminated signs, shown by the red circles on the plan, to indicate the one way system or the no entry (at the Nichols Street / Gladstone Street junction) and the

removal of the existing illuminated give way sign at the Nichols Street / B576 junction (indicated by the black circle). In addition to the illuminated signs we would also require some non-illuminated one way repeater signs and "New Road Layout" ahead signs along these roads.

Option 2 is as the above but with Nichols Street retained as two way. This would require less signing and give the residents of Nichols Street a bit more flexibility with regard to access / egress.

A few points worth noting about either arrangement include:

- This would put more pressure onto Station Road as the eastbound Nichols Street / Gladstone Street route from the B576 would be unavailable
- Without the presence of oncoming traffic along Gladstone Street this may make this route more desirable for HGV's leaving the Fishery site.
- Speeds generally increase with the introduction of one way roads as there is no opposing traffic to reduce vehicle speeds which may lead to further complaints from residents.
- An extensive consultation exercise would need to be carried out with residents affected.
- Parking restrictions at the Nichols Street / Gladstone Street junction may need reviewing.

With regard to costs, as a guesstimate, I would think in the region of £30- £35,000 for either option. This would include the traffic regulation order for the one way system, illuminated and non-illuminated signing, road markings and the buildouts including revisions to kerbing / drainage.

For more detailed estimates our engineering team would need to do further investigations on site and to obtain records of the utility company equipment in the area etc. which unfortunately there would be a charge for their time. If you would like to proceed with further investigation of any of the above options please do not hesitate to contact me and I can arrange to give you an idea of the likely costs for this.
