Zoos in the UK are covered by the Zoo Licensing Act 1981 (as amended by the Zoo Licensing Act 1981 (Amendment) (England and Wales) Regulations 2002). The Guide to the Act's Provisions are covered by 2012 Version. This inspection was made in accordance with the requirements of this legislation.

In assessing the standards required of a Zoo, reference is made to The Secretary of State's Standards of Modern Zoo Practice (2012 Edition).

The Inspectors role is to identify problems (i.e. where minimum standards are not being met), not to provide solutions. However, where problems are identified, discussions will be open and inclusive of all parties on how best to deal with them. In general, Inspectors will support and encourage zoos to make necessary improvements and should know where to direct the zoo for information if they cannot provide this advice themselves.

Inspectors can only inspect and report on the information gathered on the day of the inspection. Records and record-keeping systems will be sampled and interrogated. The annual stock records will be checked to assess animal movements, mortality etc. The stock record should be in six or seven columns, as long as required information is provided. Unexpectedly high mortalities will warrant further investigation.

Compliance with the Zoo Licensing Act 1981 (as amended) does not imply that the requirements of any other legislation have been met. The licence holder should ensure that he/she is aware of the requirements under CITES regulating the commercial use of specimens listed on Annex A of the CITES regulations. We would like to thank the Zoo Management and Staff for their hospitality on this inspection.

We were very impressed by the many improvements made and implemented since my last Inspection. The displays were natural but informative and the use of the new signs educational and appropriate and should be applauded. I considered this Zoo, although small, is now of a very high standard.

Zoos in the UK are granted a licence under the Zoo Licensing Act 1981 (Amendment) (England and Wales) Regulations 2002 to comply with the EC Zoos Directive 1999/22/EC. In pursuance of section 9 of the Zoo Licensing Act 1981, The Secretary of State has specified the Standards of Modern Zoo Practice. It is clear that this Zoo is mindful and compliant of these Standards and should be encourage to go beyond these.

The Zoo is also reminded to discuss all planning matters well in advance with the Local Authority.

The following are recommendations. These are not currently to be conditions but are made in order to maintain and improve standards. :-

Recommendations:-

- 1. The stand off mesh in the primate area needs attention to remove or cover the sharp edges.
- 2. A secure method of backing up and archiving records should be introduced.
- 3. Agreement should be reached with the Local Authority as to the frequency of PAT and electrical system checking and certification.
- 4. The setting of Bonfires should be stopped or limited to a frequency as agreed with the Local Authority.
- 5. Details of the waste disposal arrangements should be provided to, discussed and agreed, with the Local Authority.
